

## *Dr. Suzanne Rappaport, OTD, OTR/L, USA*



Dr. Suzanne Rappaport, OTD, OTR/L believes life to be a big adventure, so she left her corporate career to pursue art, skiing, and flying trapeze. After years of wandering, she realized these activities would make a great therapeutic intervention and found occupational therapy. Dr. Rappaport now spends her time in academia, as well as, working with students with mental health challenges, teaching adaptive ski lessons, and serving food to the homeless. In addition to her clinical roles, she has presented her research work at the MAOT annual conference, the AOTA Conference, as well as, internationally at COT, OT24Vx, and at WFOT.

## **Dr. Pat Precin, PhD, PsyD, NCPsyA, LP, OTR/L, FAOTA, USA**



Dr. Pat Precin is an Assistant Professor in Occupational Therapy at Columbia University and a licensed practicing psychoanalyst in New York, USA. She has two doctorates, one in Research Psychology and the other in Psychoanalysis with additional degrees in Biophysics, Pre-Medicine, Psychology, and Occupational Therapy. She has practiced psychosocial OT for over 35 years with extensive publications and presentations. Pat, along with two of her colleagues, were awarded a 1.9 million dollar 4-year inter-professional grant to provide people with and educate people on trauma informed care in underserved areas of the USA.

**Title:** An Occupational Therapy Recovery Process for Psychological Trauma

*Dr. Mohamed Tricha*, MD, PhD, Morocco

Head of Rehabilitation and Neurosciences Department



Dr. Tricha is the Head of Rehabilitation and Neurosciences Department and Professor of Biomechanics, Faculty of Science in Rabat, University Mohamed V, Rabat, Morocco.
